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The Night Stages by Jane Urquhart – This is a new novel by the author that also wrote Away and The Stone Carvers. This story takes place in a remote area of County Kerry in the 1940's & 50's. This is a very emotional story that explores the meaning of separation, the sorrows of fractured families, and the profound effect of home in a world where a way of life is changing.

Obsession In Death by J. D. Robb – Lieutenant Eve Dallas walks the thin line between love and hate in this latest thriller. Eve who has solved a lot of high-profile murders for the NYPSP and along with her billionaire husband has gotten a lot of media, is accustomed to being an object of attention, of gossip and of speculation. But now she has become the object of one person's obsession. Someone who believes the two of them have a special relationship, who would kill for her again and again. A good read.

Motive by Jonathan Kellerman – Psychologist Alex Delaware and homicide cop Milo Sturgis against a vicious criminal mind – the kind only Kellerman can bring to chilling life. Even having hundreds of closed cases to his credit can't keep LAPD lieutenant Milo Sturgis from agonizing over the crimes that don't get solved – and the victims who go without justice. But the only thing to do is move on to the next murder case – because there's always a next one.

Cold Betrayal by J. A. Jance – This is a novel with popular character Ali Reynolds. Any hope that she and her husband, B. Simpson, will finally slow down and relax now that they've tied the knot are dashed when Ali's new daughter-in-law approaches her, desperate for help. The girl's grandmother Betsy is in danger:

she's been receiving anonymous threats, and someone even broke into her home and turned on the gas burners in the middle of the night. But the local police think the elderly woman's just not as sharp as she used to be.....

Lonely Girl by Josephine Cox – One fateful night changes the course of a child's life forever. Grieving and alone, Rosie is thrust into a harsh reality, and has to face the obstacles that fate has set in her path. But secrets will out, and Rosie must uncover the shocking truth behind her mother's cruelty before she can hope for the love and happiness she deserves.
